FISH ATTRACTORS / LAKE STRUCTURES: In order to give a protected environment for our fish investment, we have applied for a permit for placing fish habitat structures. The structures added to our lakes will attract fish, allowing them to hide from predators, as well as give them a safe place for breeding. A placement study was done with the DNR, to pinpoint twelve desirable places between both lakes (indicated on the map below.) The lake structure permit was applied for, public notice was provided to and signed by all lake residents whose property lines fall within 200 feet of the structures, and an ad was placed in the newspaper, as notice to those outside of the required 200 feet. We are now ready to build and place these structures into our lakes!



#### **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED:**

Erik Pearson, Board member, is looking to form a committee of volunteers to complete this project. The project will consist of constructing 60-240, fish attractor structures (4'x6'x4' brush piles.) Clusters of 5-20 structures, with concrete blocks attached to them, will be placed at each of the twelve determined locations. If you are interested in building or placing structures, or both, please contact Erik as soon as you can!

**CHANNEL DETERIORATION:** Deterioration shoreline is causing natural sedimentation to slide down and fill in the bottom of our main channel. Our boats need a maintained level of water to pass through. Effort on our part will keep the channel from becoming impassable. The biggest effect on shoreline deterioration is boat speed. By law, boats are to be at Idle at all times while in our channels. We are No Wake / 10MPH Lakes, meaning idle speed within 200 feet of our shorelines, and no speed greater than 10mph in open water. Hoping to help rectify this issue, the Association Board has approved the purchase two "Idle Speed" buoys, to be placed at each opening of the main channel. Remember, just because the buoys are not out during the winter does not change the laws. No one wants to lose out on utilizing both of our beautiful lakes, so PLEASE do your part by adhering to the legal lake speeds.

**FISH STOCKING:** On October 5<sup>th</sup>, 3600 Walleye were stocked into our lakes. This event brings our past three year fish stocking count to an approximate 10,000 Walleye, 3,500 Catfish and 360 Northern Pike. That's a 14,420 fish in three years and over 32,420 fish in eighteen years!!! The efforts put in the by committee and members through time and contributions are appreciated. Thank you for helping to make a better lake environment, for everyone.

Fish Stocking Side Note: Erik Pearson has researched the request to add a stock of Smallmouth Bass . After the general meeting discussion that 50% of Smallmouth Bass stock will be eaten by predators, while at an approximate cost of \$1800 for 1000, it has been decided to table further discussion on the topic until after the fish attractor/structures are in place. The fish attractors will provide an environment for the Smallmouth to hide from predators, hopefully giving them a better survival rate.

LAKE WATER QUALITY: Not only has this year shown a decrease in gizzard shad schooling activity, but the brown algae is also beginning to clear up. By increasing desirable fish quantity, decreasing gizzard shad population, and limiting weed/plant removal, our lakes are getting healthier and clarity is improving. The Association will be adding fish structures and will continue their Fish Stocking program. Our Community will need to continue their efforts to maintain and increase our scarce plant life. The purpose of taking weeds/plants out of our lakes is to allow boats to get in and out, not to establish beaches for swimming and recreation. Before removing any plant life, please consider both our water quality and the wildlife that depend on a healthy weed/plant environment.



**SEWER PROJECT:** Adam Sams, of LaGrange County Regional Utility District has advised us that the sewer project is going as well as can be expected. Even after having a few hold ups with equipment, because of covid-19, the schedule still has Fish and Royer to be pumping to the Region B plant by the end of the year. The project has received another 2.6 million for the next phase as hoped. The next positive thing is that they have made some further evaluations that were in the original scope of work and were able to remove around 1 million in construction costs. They are now hoping to only have two phases of the project, cutting some of the soft cost out, and still be at the monthly charge of \$81 (+change.)



PLEASE DO NOT LITTER: If you dropped it, pick it up. If you brought it, take it with you. 






WOOD DUCK BOXES: Now that the Osprey nesting posts are in place, there's hope that some of the Osprey chicks born nearby sought out our platforms, and will return over the next couple April-May nesting seasons. Until then, we are moving our focus to the next wildlife project... Wood duck boxes! These wooden box structures may not only help boost local wood duck population, but they may also be used by other cavity nesting birds, including mergansers, tree swallows and screech owls. The Board has approved \$200 towards supplies, and we have volunteers willing to build boxes. If you would like to build your own box, plans can be found on our website. 
**GEESE:** Many residents have complained about too many geese on their lawns this year. Due to the chance of unhealthy conditions developing, the Association Board has discussed two possibilities to correct the issue: 1) There is a company permitted in the state of Indiana to apply a natural product, Flight Control, which leaves a bitter taste on the grass that the geese won't eat. Though this option can be purchased by the landowners, more research needs to be done regarding possible impact to the environment and fauna. 2) There is a company that will do a goose round up, relocating them to Pigeon River, at an approximate cost of \$2 per goose. This option would require volunteers, and payment would be made through the Association. - Since options require a Spring decision, before the goslings can fly, this topic will be discussed further at an early year board meeting. If you are not currently a paid member, but wish to receive goose maintenance, please consider paying your dues for 2021.

### **2021 EVENTS & ACTIVITIES:**

All events are open to change depending upon county and state regulations relating to the pandemic.

While staying within any government guidelines and /or restrictions, we are hopeful to have our annual meeting, community garage sale, flotilla, fishing tournaments, golf outing and fundraiser dinner.
