

FISH ATTRACTORS / LAKE STRUCTURES: Erik Pearson, Board member, is looking for volunteers to assist with constructing 60-240 fish attractor structures (4'x6'x4' brush piles) Saturday, March 19, starting at 9:00am. Additional volunteers will also be needed in March at attach the structures to concrete blocks, and place clusters of 5-20 at each of the twelve determined lake locations. FISH STOCKING: Upon completing our fish habitat structure project this Spring, our fish investment will have an extra layer of protection, creating a greater survival expectancy; therefore, our 2021 Fish Stocking goals are:

- 360 Northern Pike
- 1800 Walleye
- 1800 Smallmouth Bass
- Catfish: remain on list to receive DNR overstock

Only one fish stocking event will take place in 2021, sometime in October or November. Dates will be posted on Facebook when confirmed.

WATER LEVEL MAINTENANCE / FLY CREEK CLEARINGS: Our goal is to avoid flooding. And, we can get paid to do it! When Fly Creek backs up with debris, lake waters rise. If levels get too high, flooding will occur. In hopes to avoid this, Jay Benak, Board member, is looking to form a committee of volunteers willing to assist with clearing Fly Creek. A gage has been added to Royer Lake so level data can be tracked. If levels increasingly rise, Jay will walk Fly Creek. If debris clearing is needed, the DNR will be contacted. If the Association is contracted, those on the committee will be contacted to set up a date/time to complete the job. Keeping Fly Creek cleared of debris is a necessity to avoid flooding. Please understand that if we are unable to set up volunteers willing to participate, a crew will be hired to clear the creek, taking away monies that could have gone into our Fish Stocking fund.

The committee of volunteers will gather a day or two, periodically throughout the year, to clear debris. Keeping our lake waters at a safe level can avoid flooding, as well as a great way to boost our fish stocking funds too, as it has already risen over \$13,000 towards our Fish Stocking Fund! We have added Osprey nesting posts and Wood Duck nesting boxes to invite positive wildlife on our lakes, as well as researching solutions to reduce nuisance wildlife. We are doing our best to hold our annual events, as well as being hopeful to add new community activities. We will continue to keep our community up to date with information through Facebook, website, flyer, and of course, our quarterly newsletters.

We are a Lake Association, not a Home Owners Association. We do not have authority over individually owned properties. Yet, even though the Association does not have the ability to fine or warn individuals not complying with local laws or ordinances, we still want to work with you as a Community. Resolutions to these concerns may need you to address the issue with the individual(s) causing concern, or to directly report the incident to the sheriff's office. 


