

DID YOU KNOW

Fish-Royer Lakes Association is not a homeowner's association. There are no rules or regulations pertaining to your home or property that are set forth by the Lake association. Only county regulations apply. The sole purpose of the Association is to preserve and protect Fish Lake and Royer Lake and their surroundings. We also monitor each lake for environmental and ecological changes, promote activities which will enhance water quality, improve fishing, swimming, boating, navigation, and the aesthetic values of Fish Lake and Royer Lake as a public recreational facility, for today and for generations to come. The DNR implements and enforces all boating fishing and trapping rules and regulations.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU FALL THROUGH THE ICE

Stay calm, minimize time in the water. Get out as soon as possible safely. If possible, utilize any floating objects to get out of the water. Evaluate your options. If you can swim to safety, stay calm and do so. If you cannot swim to safety, conserve energy and heat and await rescue. If you cannot get to safety, assume the heat escape lessening position (H.E.L.P) position. This protects the critical body areas and slow down the loss of heat. H.E.L.P positions means; draw your knees to your chin and keep your legs together and press both arms against your side and keep your head out of the water. Minimize time in the water.
